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








World War One Living History

Students from Years 8, 9, 10 and 11 Modern History had the opportunity to learn about the experiences of life as an Australian solider on the Western Front. Shane presented students with a hands on experience by using authentic artefacts. The use of these artefacts helped place Shane's riveting stories in a very particular time and made the demonstrations more real and, at times, confronting in their honesty. 
