



Year 7 & 9 Students - NAPLAN Online 2021

Dear Parents/Carers

In May all Year 7 and 9 students across Australia will take part in the National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN).

NAPLAN is designed to help parents/carers and teachers better judge how Year 7 and 9 students are performing in relation to nationally-agreed standards.

NAPLAN assessments will be conducted in Writing, Language Conventions (spelling, grammar and punctuation), Reading and Numeracy.

The NAPLAN assessments will take place during normal school time in the week commencing 10 May (Week 4, Term 2).

Students absent on the assessment day/s will be provided with an opportunity to do the assessment the following week. Withdrawal and Exemption, and Access to Disability Adjustments forms can be accessed by contacting the school.
