

Positive Behaviour for Learning (PBL)


- First Silver Award Recipients


P&C Dinner in White


The team performed several of these pieces at the Regional Dance Festival in Tamworth earlier in the year.








































Term 4 Junior English Assessment Due Dates



Ambulance Cover Scheme

In the event that a NSW school student is provided with emergency ambulance services within NSW, an invoice will be generated in the name of the person to whom these services have been provided. On receipt of the invoice the parent/guardian should:



- If the parent/guardian has private health insurance, a health care card, pensioner concession card or a Commonwealth Health Seniors Card then these details should be recorded in the relevant section on the back of the invoice, and returned to NSW Ambulance.
- If the parent/guardian has no other form of ambulance insurance they should forward the invoice to the student's school. The school will provide official certification that the services are covered, and forward it to NSW Ambulance.
















GIHS P&C Dinner in White
